1. Control forest fires on immigration routes

2. -Less caribou biologist interference

-Helicopter harvesting caribou while collaring, which may result in females dropping their fetus before birth.

3. More predator control, examples are wolves, bears etc.

4. More control given to communities to control and regulate their own harvesting, no tags for Fort Good Hope.

5. No sponsored hunts on barren land caribou of any kind

6. Deline plans of caribou management should apply to Deline District only hunters from Deline should not hunt in other districts unless agreed by affected RRC's.

7. Fort Good Hope RRC has already been doing control of caribou hunting for the past three years.


1. No sponsored hunts in Colville Lake area.

2. Sponsoring other hunts such as fishing, moose hunting etc.

3. The Board is also considering banning hunting during migration season.

4. Need more funding to do alternative hunting, reopen traditional trails to past harvesting areas.
