1. Call to Order

3. New Business

- a) Position Statements Re: Wildlife Management Boards (WMB) Co-Chair Meeting Agenda Items
 - i. Bill C-5: Species at Risk Act
 - Bill C-5 (previously known as Bill C-33) was put before Parliament in February 2001; has gone through 1st and 2nd reading as well as the standing committee; Federal Environment Minister hoped to have the Bill go through 3rd reading by November 2001; however, continue to have problems with the listing process (too political) and habitat protection (too limited)
 - Nunavut Wildlife Management Board (NWMB) and NWT Wildlife Management Advisory Council (WMAC-NWT) made submissions to the standing committee regarding the Bill

ii. Wildlife Act (Federal & Territorial)

- To date, WMB have not been formally included in consultation process
- Discussion paper released "Drafting a New Wildlife Act: Conservation for Today and Tomorrow"; good base for public information;

representatives from both WAAG and RWED will soon be visiting each community in the NWT for further consultations

 SRRB's executive committee to meet with Doug Stewart in October 2001 regarding issues in relation to the new NWT Wildlife Act

iii. DIAND Funding Agreement - The Next 10 Years

- Due to federal and territorial cutbacks, additional staff should be hired
 - o Fisheries/forestry biologist
 - Conservation education officer
- Wildlife Studies Fund was it a one time only payment or can it be renegotiated for the new ten-year period?
- Concerns about the Sahtu Land Use Planning Board
 - o Who will implement the recommendations?
 - Will the board continue independently or be moved to Sahtu Land & Water Board or SRRB offices; SSI should be investigating this concern; SRRB to write a letter to raise the issue with SSI

iv. Cumulative Effects Assessment and Management Steering Committee

- SSI and Gwich'in Tribal Council were not participating in the process;
 SRRB has attended one workshop; have not provided further support as unsure of SSI's current position
- Determine other WMB's positions

v. Wildlife Research Permits

- SRRB's recommendation to the Minister of RWED; WMB to make strong response to Joe Handley's letter
- GRRB have same concerns
 - o Insufficient review time
 - o Receiving permits that have nothing to do with region

vi. Proposed Hydro-Dam Development

- Discuss with WMB, World Wildlife Fund, Ducks Unlimited, Ecology North, Canadian Parks and Wilderness Society, and others the idea of devising a unified response to hydro development (be pro-active)
- Group would include all those affected (including non-settled areas);
 demand GNWT provide all available information; propose alternative developments that would be less impacting, e.g., in-stream turbines
- With GIS, modeling can be done to determine impacts of development
 - o Loss of recreational potential
 - Loss of wildlife habitat (particularly island moose habitat)
 - o Loss of fish habitat

vii. Traditional/Community Knowledge

 Currently, SRRB requires TEK in research applications, local people are hired, GIS collection, and community consultations (includes beneficiaries being present at board meetings); to be used at every opportunity

- GRRB also does not have a formal policy; however have taken a proactive role in collecting TEK; have published two books about wildlife and TEK
- Concerns raised about why SRRB is not collecting TEK similar to GRRB; SRRB felt that perhaps SSI should take the lead in devising a plan to deal with the collection and storage of TEK; each Sahtu comanagement board would provide info relating to their mandate

viii. Harvest Studies

- SRRB hopes to continue the harvest study; information gathered is too important to completely quit; to decide whether it will be continued at present level or to be scaled back
- GRRB continued harvest study for two years
- To ask WMB what they plan to do with their studies

b) Position Statement Re: Mackenzie Valley Pipeline

- No applications have been filed to date
- Additional resources will be required in anticipation of the increased workload (request from DIAND in next ten-year period)
 - o Staffing
 - o Training & monitoring programs
 - o Office space
 - o Community information distribution
- To remain politically impartial as WMB; SRRB will be major player in the review of Environmental Impact Assessments; concerns about wildlife and wildlife habitat will have to be addressed to our satisfaction

c) Conflict of Interest

- All board members and alternates received a letter from the Office of the Ethics Counselor re: conflict of Interest Guidelines; suggestion to get legal opinion regarding guidelines (plain English)
- Public perception is very important; although activity may be business/economic development based, may be seen as political by the public; involvement of media to confirm SRRB position?
- MVEIRB had legal opinion done regarding conflict of interest; Winter to get copy

4. Additional Business

a) Minister of RWED's letter

- Members feel that the Minister did not deal with recommendations; rather just 'tossed the ball back'
- Executive committee to meet with Doug Stewart on Oct. 11; be firm about SRRB position

b) Mentor/Supervisor for Biologist

- To provide direction and guidance; to be 100% satisfied that biologist is on the right track
- Paul or Norm to take active role; more frequent calls; to be discussed with biologist
