Déline 2021 Overarching Question

What should people's role be in maintaining healthy relationships between caribou and other wildlife?



Topics carried forward

- The conservation picture: caribou, people and planning – how are things going?
- Community conservation plan approvals and updates
- Zones: should the hunting area boundaries for barren-ground caribou change?
- Wildlife Act Residency
- Funding/program framework for community conservation planning

Predators



- What stories or knowledge would you like to share about the past and present relationships between caribou, díga and Dene/Métis?
- Should people play a role in controlling díga populations to help caribou now? If so, what should this look like?
- Are there any concerns that you have about other predators and their impacts on caribou?

- Should there be more encouragement to harvest pejire, including a commercial harvest and for food security to help caribou? If so, what should this look like?
- Are there any other concerns that you have about other competitors and their impacts on caribou?









 □ Appropriate seasons of harvest and harvest locations
 □ Respectful harvesting and meat handling protocols
 □ Community sharing protocols and agreements with other users within and beyond the Sahtú
- □ Harvest monitoring, including methods and reporting protocols and timelines
 □ Caribou monitoring
 □ Food security/alternative harvest
 □ Hunter/youth training
 □ Measures for supporting compliance, including enforcement
 □ Key strengths, challenges, and strategies,


